RF Exposure

General Statement on RF Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your device transmits.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR)

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. These guidelines were developed by the independent scientific organization ICNIRP and include safety margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The guidelines use a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 1.58 W/kg. As mobile

devices offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this user guide.

As SAR is measured utilizing the device's highest transmitting power, the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to communicate with the network.

Device Heating

Your device may become warm during charging and during normal use.

Accessories

Use only approved accessories.

Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories.

Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

Connection to a Car

Seek professional advice when connecting a mobile device interface to the vehicle electrical system.

Faulty and Damaged Products

Do not attempt to disassemble the device or its accessory.

Only qualified personnel should service or repair the device or its accessory.

If your device or its accessory has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

Interference

General Statement on Interference

Care must be taken when using the mobile device in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 15 cm be maintained between a mobile device and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the mobile device on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

Hearing Aids

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby.

The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source, increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Medical Devices

Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturer to determine if operation of your mobile device may interfere with the operation of your medical device.

Hospitals

Switch off your wireless device when requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or health care facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

Aircraft

Switch off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff.

Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices on board the aircraft, if your device offers a 'flight mode' this must be enabled prior to boarding an aircraft.

Interference in Cars

Please note that because of possible interference to electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.

Explosive Environments

Petrol Stations and Explosive Atmospheres

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment.


Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fuelling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

Blasting Caps and Areas

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas posted power off "two-way radios" or "electronic devices" to avoid interfering with blasting operations.

Starting up

Installing Your SIM/memory Card

Power off your Reliance 3G Tab before installing or replacing the battery, SIM card, or memory card.

1. Remove the back cover.



2. Insert your SIM card into the SIM slot. There is a diagram showing the correct orientation of the card printed above the SIM slot.



3. Insert your memory card into the memory card slot. There is a diagram showing the correct orientation of the card printed above the memory card slot.

Inserting Battery

- 1. Insert the battery with the contacts located against the metal springs.
- 2. Push the battery down into place.



Charging Your Reliance 3G Tab

The new battery is not fully charged. To charge the battery, you need to:

1. Connect the adapter to the charger jack.



2. Connect the charger to a standard AC wall outlet.

Notes:

- If the battery is low, there will be a pop-up message on the screen and the indicator light will be red.
- When you charge your device, the indicator light will change according to the battery level:

Indicator color	Battery level
Red	Less than 10% of the total battery level
	More than 10%, but less than 90% of the total battery level
Green	More than 90% of the total battery level

- If the device is powered on and the battery is charging, the icon will appear on the status bar. When charging is completed, the battery indicator appears on the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.

Powering on/off Your Device

Powering on/off Your Device

- 1. Make sure your SIM card and the battery are inserted.
- 2. Press and hold the Power Key to power on your device.

To power off your device, press and hold the **Power Key** to get the Device options, select **Power off**, and then Touch **OK**.

Switching Your Device to Sleep Mode Press the Power Key.

Sleep Mode suspends your device to a low-power-consumption state while the display is off to save battery power. Your device also goes into Sleep Mode automatically when you leave it idle after a certain period of time.

Waking up Your Device from Sleep Mode

If your device is switched to tablet optionssleep mode, you need to wake it up:

- 1. Press the Power Key to activate your screen display.
- 2. Drag icon to the right.



Notes:

If you have set an unlock pattern for your device, you need to draw the pattern to unlock your screen.

Getting Around Your Device

Touch Control

You can use finger gestures to control your device. The controls on your touch screen change dynamically depending on the tasks you're performing.

- Touch the buttons, icons, or applications to select items or to open applications.
- Keep your finger on an item to see the available options.
- Flick the screen to scroll up, down, left or right.
- Point, drag and drop to move particular items across the screen.
- Pinch with two fingers, or double-tap the screen, to zoom in/out on a web page or an image.

NOTE: You can view the phone screen in portrait or landscape orientation simply by holding it upright or turning it on its side.

Contacts

Starting to use Contacts

You can add new contacts along with their information. Setting up communication information for the contact will allow you to call the person quickly or browse the contact's information. Contacts are saved in the internal memory or in the SIM card. If you store the information in the SIM card, you can fill the name and a number. If you store the information in the internal memory, you can also fill out more information including Email, Postal address, pictures, Nickname, website, etc.

Touch the **Home Key** > **I** to enter the Contacts Screen.

Contacts Screen

There are five tabs in the Contacts Screen: Dialer, Call log, Contacts, Favorites, and Groups.



Importing/Exporting Contacts

You can import/export contacts from/to you SIM card or microSD card.

Import/export contacts from/to SIM card

- 1. Touch the **Menu Key/** > **Import/Export** from the Contacts Screen.
- Select to import or export contacts from/to your SIM card. Your Reliance 3G Tab will automatically read the contacts.
- 3. Select the contacts you want to import/export.

If you want to import contacts from microSD card, you should have vCard files saved in the microSD card. If there is more than one vCard file, you need to select the vCard file.

Sharing Contacts Information

- Press Menu Key and touch Import/Export > Share visible contacts from the Contacts Screen. Your phone will export all information of the contacts in the Contact Screen to a temporary vCard file.
- 2. Choose how you want to send the vCard file. You can send it via

Bluetooth, mail or messages.

Creating a Contact

- Touch the Menu Key/ > New contact from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Select the location to save your contact.
- 3. Enter the name and phone numbers. You can also set the Group, Email addresses, IM addresses, Postal addresses, Organizations etc. if you select to create a phone contact.
- 4. Touch Done to save the contact.

- 2. Touch the 22 icon at the bottom of the contact details screen. Tips:

You can also edit a contact by holding it in the Contacts Screen and select **Edit contact** from the pop-up shortcut menu.

3. Edit the contact and touch Done.

Deleting a Contact

- 1. Select the contact you want to delete from the Contacts Screen.
- 2. Touch the mill icon at the bottom of the contact details screen. Tips:

You can also delete a contact by holding it in the Contacts Screen and select **Delete contact** from the pop-up shortcut menu.

Entering Text

Using the On-screen Keyboard

When you enter a field that needs text or numbers, hold the input box and select **Input method** from the pop-up menu to change input method.

Android Keyboard

Android Keyboard is a keyboard layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. You can choose to use the landscape orientation of the on-screen keyboard, by turning the Reliance 3G Tab sideways.



XT9 Text Input

XT9 Text Input can speed up text input by replacing the letter touching/typing motion of input with a tracing gesture where you move your finger from letter to letter without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.

You can select to use one of the three layouts (**Keyboard**, **Reduced keyboard**, **Phone keypad**) of XT9 Text Input Keyboard.

Move your finger from letter to letter to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.



- 3. Select the numbers or symbols.

Input Settings

You can configure the touch input settings by touching the **Menu Key >** Settings > Language & keyboard from Home Screen.

Select language

Select the language you used.

XT9 Text Input

- Languages and settings: Select input languages. Touch a language to set up keyboard layout, word suggestion settings, key input settings, trace input settings, and handwriting input settings.
- **Preferences:** Set up keypress vibration, keypress sound, auto-capitalization, and auto-punctuation.
- About: View the XT9 version information.

Android keyboard

- Vibrate on keypress: Enables vibration feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- Sound on keypress: Enables the sound feedback as you touch on the keyboard.
- **Popup on keypress**: Enables popup feedback of letters when you touch the keyboard.
- Touch to correct words: Touch entered words to correct them.
- Auto-capitalization: Select the check box to capitalize the fist letter of each sentence automatically.

- Show settings key: choose to show or hide the settings key.
- Voice input: Enables you to input by voice instead of typing.
- Input languages: Select the input language.

Messages

Messaging is where all of your SMS and MMS accounts are located. To access your message accounts, touch the Home Key > \square > Messages.

Exchanging Messages

From Messages, you can receive and send an SMS or MMS.

When you receive a new message, you can open it from the Notifications Panel, or from Messages Screen. Simply touch on the new message to read it.

The device will alert you for the unread message(s) with the icon $\stackrel{\text{period}}{=}$ in the status bar.

Composing an SMS

1. Touch the Home Key > M.

- 2. Touch New message.
- Touch To field and enter the recipient's number. You can also enter the letters of the recipient; the contact which matches the first letter of the recipient name is listed, and then you can select a recipient from the list.
- 4. Touch **Type to compose** field and enter the message.
- 5. Touch Send to send your SMS.

Composing an MMS

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 🖂.
- 2. Touch New message.
- Touch To field and enter the recipient's number. You can also enter the letters of the recipient, the contact which match the first letter of the recipient name is listed, and then select a recipient from the list.
- 4. Touch the **Menu Key > Add subject** to enter the subject of your MMS.

- 5. Touch **Type to compose** field and enter the message.
- 6. Touch the Menu Key > Attach to add an attachment to your MMS:
 - Pictures: Select a picture to add to your MMS.
 - Capture picture: Take a photo and add to your MMS.
 - Videos: Select a video clip to attach to your MMS.
 - Capture video: Shoot a video clip and add to your MMS.
 - Audio: Select an audio file to add to your MMS.
 - Record audio: Record an audio file and add to your MMS.
 - Slideshow: Edit a slideshow and add to your MMS.
- 7. Touch Send to send your MMS.

Tips:

- If you add a subject or an attachment to your SMS, the SMS will be converted to an MMS automatically.
- If you remove the subject and attachment of your MMS, the MMS will be converted to an SMS automatically.

Managing Messages and Messages Threads

SMS and MMS messages which are sent to and received are grouped into message threads in the Messages screen. Threaded messages show you exchanged messages (similar to a chat program) with a specific contact on the screen. Message threads are sorted by the time when you received them, with the latest one on the top.

Reply to a message

- 1. Touch the message you want to reply to from the Messages Screen.
- 2. Touch **Type to compose** and enter the contents of your message.
- 3. Touch Send.

Delete a message (thread)

- 1. Touch the Menu Key > Delete threads from the Messages Screen.
- 2. Select the messages or threads you want to delete.
- 3. Touch Delete.

Message Settings

Touch the **Menu Key > Settings** from the Messages Screen. You can configure your message settings.

Storage settings

- Delete old messages: Select to delete old messages as limits are reached.
- **Text message limit**: Set the maximum number of text messages allowed in a single thread.
- **Multimedia message limit**: Set the maximum number of multimedia messages allowed in a single thread.

Text message (SMS) settings

- **Delivery reports**: Request a delivery report for each SMS message you send.
- Manage SIM card messages: Manage messages stored on your SIM card.
- SMS validity: Set a period time of SMS validity.

- **SMS priority**: Set the priority for SMS.
- Service Center: Enables you to view and edit the service center.

Multimedia message (MMS) settings

- **Delivery reports**: Request a delivery report for each MMS message you send.
- Read reports: Request a read report for each MMS message you send.
- Auto-retrieve: Select to retrieve MMS messages automatically.
- Roaming auto-retrieve: Select to retrieve MMS messages automatically when you are roaming.
- MMS validity: Set a period time of MMS validity.
- MMS creation mode: Enables you to create the MMS correctly. Notifications settings
- Notifications: Select to display message notifications in the status bar.
- Select ringtone: Select a ringtone for your incoming messages.
- Vibrate: Select to make your 3G Tab vibrate when receiving a new message.

Signature settings

- Edit signature: Edit your signature.
- Add signature: Create a new signature.

Using Email

Touch the **Home Key** > 2. You can enter the Email Screen to setup your Email account and exchange Emails.

Creating an Email account

- 1. Enter your Email address and password, and then touch **Next** when you enter the Email Screen for the first time.
- 2. Touch **Manual setup** to add new email account. Select a type of account and touch **Next**.
- 3. Edit the incoming server settings and then touch Next/Next[Check].

If you touch **Next[Check]**, your device will check the incoming server settings and finish the setup automatically. If you are notified that setup could not be finished, you might need to correct some settings to finish it. If there is any problem, please contact your mobile service provider and Email service provider.

4. Edit the outgoing server settings and touch Next/Next[Check].

If you touch **Next[Check]**, your device will check the outgoing server settings and finish the setup automatically.

- 5. Set the Email checking frequency, select whether to use this account by default or be notified when Email arrives, and then touch **Next**.
- 6. Set up the download options and the message number per download, and then touch **Next**.

Composing and sending an Email

After creating an Email account, you can compose and send Email messages.

- 1. Touch the **Menu Key > Compose** from the Email Screen.
- 2. Touch the **To** field and enter the recipient's address.

When you enter the address, the matching addresses saved in your **Contacts** will be displayed. You can touch the recipient from the list. **Tips:**

You can also touch the **Menu Key > Add Cc/Bcc** to add recipients.

- 3. Enter the subject and the content of your Email.
- 4. Touch Send.

Reply to or Forward an Email

- 1. Open the Email you want to reply to or forward from Email Screen.
- 2. Touch **Reply** or the **Menu Key > Forward** to reply to/forward the Email.

You can also touch Reply all to reply to all recipients of the Email.

- 3. Enter the contents/recipients of your Email.
- 4. Touch Send.

Email Settings

You can touch **Menu Key > More > System settings** to set up storage, exchange and other settings.

Getting Connected

Connecting to the Internet

Your device's networking capabilities allow you to access the Internet or your corporate network.

Ways of Connecting to the Internet

You can use the default connection settings to connect to the Internet through your mobile network (GSM/WCDMA), or Wi-Fi.

GSM/WCDMA

Use GSM/WCDMA to connect to the Internet and to send and receive MMS/Email messages on your Reliance 3G Tab. You will need a data plan to use your wireless service provider's GSM/WCDMA network. Check with your wireless service provider for GSM/WCDMA rates. If the GSM/WCDMA settings are not pre-configured on your device, contact your operator for the parameters. Do not change the settings as this may cause services to stop working.

Adding a new GSM/WCDMA connection

Before you begin, get the following information from your service provider:

- Access Point Name (APN)
- Your user name and password if needed.
- Server IP and the port number if the network uses a proxy server.
- 1. Touch the Home Key > 🔛 > Settings > Wireless & networks > Mobile networks > Access Point Names.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key > New APN.
- 3. Touch each item to enter the information you get from your service provider.
- 4. Touch Menu Key and touch Save to complete.

Notes:

If you want to set the APN to default settings, touch the **Menu Key >** Reset to default.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi provides wireless Internet access over distances of up to 300 feet (100 meters).

Turning on Wi-Fi

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 🔛 > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the Wi-Fi check box to turn Wi-Fi on.

Adding a Wi-Fi Network

1. Touch the Home Key > ↔ > Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings.

The Wi-Fi network names and security settings (open network or secured network) of detected Wi-Fi networks are displayed in the **Wi-Fi networks** section.

- 2. Touch a network to connect.
 - If you select an open network, you will be automatically connected to the network.

• If you select a secured network, you will need to input the wireless password.

Checking the Wi-Fi Network Status

You can check the Wi-Fi network status from the status bar and wireless controls.

- Check the ricon in the status bar.
- Touch the Home Key > I > Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings, then touch the wireless network that the device is currently connected to.

You can check the network status from the pop-up window.



Using Browser

You can use your Browser to browse most of the websites. Your Reliance 3G

Tab will automatically create a GSM/WCDMA connection for you while browsing web pages.

Opening Browser

Touch the **Home Key > H> Browser** to start this function.

Opening Web Pages

In **Browser**, you can open web pages through the following ways.

- Touch the address bar to enter the website you want to browse, and touch the icon.
- Touch the Menu Key > Bookmarks and select an item to open.
- Select an item from Most visited/History tab of Bookmarks Screen.

Browsing Options

When browsing web pages, you can do some operations.

- Touch the **Menu Key > Refresh** to refresh the page.
- Touch the Menu Key > More > Forward to go to the next page.

- Touch the **Menu Key > More > Add bookmark** to set the current page as bookmark.
- Touch the **Menu Key > More > Find on page** to enter the search item to view the search result.
- Touch the **Menu Key > More > Select text** and slide your on the page to select the text you want to copy.

Your Reliance 3G Tab automatically copies the selected text to the clipboard.

• Touch the **Menu Key > More > Page info** to view the page information.

Touch the **Menu Key > More > Share page** to send the page by **Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, Facebook, Google+, Twitter**, or **Messages**.

- Touch the Menu Key > More > Downloads to view the download information.
- Touch the Menu Key > More > Settings to set the browser.

 Rotate your device sideways to view the landscape Browser Screen if you select the Auto-rotate screen check box in Display settings by touching Home Key > Settings > Display.

Opening a New Browser Window

- 1. Touch the **Menu Key > New window** to open a new browser window in browser.
- 2. Touch the address bar to enter the website you want to browse.

Switching Between Different Browser Windows

If you have more than one browser window opened, you can switch between these windows.

- 1. Touch the **Menu Key > Windows** to view all the windows you opened.
- 2. Touch the page you want to browse.

Tips:

You can also touch 🗴 to close a window.

Opening Links in Web Pages

- 1. Open a web page that contains a link.
- 2. Touch a link to open the page.

You can also hold on the link to open the shortcut menu:

- Open: Open the web page.
- Open in new window: Open the web page in a new window.
- Bookmark link: Save the link to your Bookmarks.
- Save link: Download the linked web page to your Reliance 3G Tab.
- Share link: Send the link by Bluetooth, Email, Gmail, Facebook, Google+, Twitter, or Messages.
- Copy link URL: Copy the link to the clipboard.

Download Applications from Web Pages

- 1. Open a web page that contains an application link.
- 2. Touch the link or hold on the link and select **Save link** to download the application to your Reliance 3G Tab.

Notes:

Downloaded applications are saved in your microSD card.

Using Bookmarks

You can save your frequently-used pages as bookmarks on your Reliance 3G Tab.

Adding a New Bookmark

- 1. Open a web page.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key > Bookmarks.
- 3. Touch Add.
- 4. Enter a name of the bookmark and touch OK.

Editing a Bookmark

- 1. Open a Browser window.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key > Bookmarks.

- 4. Select Edit bookmark.
- 5. Edit the name or location, and then touch **OK** to save it.

Deleting a Bookmark

- 1. Open a Browser window.
- 2. Touch the Menu Key > Bookmarks.
- 3. Select an item you want to delete and hold on it until the shortcut menu pops up.
- 4. Select **Delete bookmark** and touch **OK** to confirm the deletion.

Browser Settings

You can set the Browser text size, home page etc. by touching the **Menu Key > More > Settings** from a browser window.

Page content settings

- Text size: Adjust the browser text size.
- Default zoom: Set the browser default zoom.

- Open pages in overview: Select to show overview of newly opened pages.
- **Text encoding**: Select a text encoding type.
- Block pop-up windows: Select to block pop-up windows.
- Load images: Select to show the images of web pages.
- Auto-fit pages: Select to format the web pages to fit the screen.
- Landscape-only display: Display the web pages only in landscape screen orientation.
- Enable JavaScript: Select to enable JavaScript.
- Enable plug-ins: Select to enable plug-ins.
- **Open in background**: Select to open new windows behind the current one.
- Set home page: Select to edit the home page web site.

Privacy settings

- Clear cache: Delete all the cached page contents.
- Clear history: Clear the browser navigation history.

- Accept cookies: Select to allow sites to save and read cookies.
- Clear all cookie data: Clear the browser cookies.
- **Remember form data**: Select to remember the data you type in forms for later use.
- Clear form data: Clear the saved form data.
- Enable location: Select to allow sites to request access to your location.
- Clear location access: Select to clear access for all websites.

Security settings

- Remember passwords: Select to save usernames and passwords for web sites.
- Clear passwords: Clear the saved passwords.
- Show security warnings: Select to show warnings if there is a problem with a site's security.

Advanced settings

• Set search engine: Select Google, Yahoo!, or Bing as your search engine.

- Website settings: View advanced settings for individual websites. Only available for some websites.
- Reset to default: Clear all browser data and reset all settings to default.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology. Wireless devices with Bluetooth capabilities can exchange information within a distance of about 10 meters without any physical connection. The Bluetooth devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

Turning on/off Bluetooth

- 1. Touch the Home Key > \mathbb{H} > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Select the **Bluetooth** check box to turn Bluetooth on.

The $^{\text{\%}}$ icon will be displayed in the status bar. If you want to turn Bluetooth off, clear the **Bluetooth** check box.

Notes:

By default, Bluetooth is turned off. If you turn it on, and then turn off your device, Bluetooth is also turned off. When you turn on your device again, Bluetooth turns on automatically.

Making Your Device Visible

Other devices with Bluetooth capabilities can detect your Reliance 3G Tab, establish a partnership, or use a Bluetooth service.

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 🔛 > Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Select the Bluetooth check box if needed.
- 3. Select the **Discoverable** check box to make your device visible.

Changing Your Device Name

- 1. Touch the Home Key > 🔛 > Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Select the **Bluetooth** check box if needed.

- 3. Touch Device name.
- 4. Enter the name and touch OK.

Pair with Another Bluetooth Device

You can pair your device with another device that has Bluetooth capabilities. Once you do this, the two devices must have Bluetooth turned on but do not need to be visible for you to exchange information between them.

- 1. Touch the Home Key > ↔ > Settings > Wireless & networks > Bluetooth settings.
- 2. Touch Scan for devices.

Your Reliance 3G Tab will display all reachable Bluetooth devices in the **Bluetooth devices** section.

- 3. Touch the device you want to pair with.
- 4. If necessary, type your PIN to pair and touch **OK**.
- Tip: The same PIN should be entered on the other device.

Your Reliance 3G Tab has two digital cameras, front camera and back camera.

Opening Camera

Touch the **Home Key** > 🔛 > **Camera** to open the camera. **Notes:**

You can switch from the camera to the camcorder quickly: Drag the

Taking Pictures

Aim the camera at the subject and then touch it to take the shot.

► Touch the picture at the bottom of right corner (portrait mode) of your Camera Screen to view the picture just captured.

Touch the Menu Key > Gallery to view all of your pictures.

Camera Settings

From the Camera Screen touch of to set up focus mode, exposure, picture size/quality, color effect, ISO, anti-banding, saturation, contrast, sharpness, and restore the default camera settings.

Touch or to choose whether to save photo's geographic location.

Touch **and** to change white balance.

Touch 1x to zoom in or out.

to select front camera or back camera.

Tip: To change quickly from camera to camcorder or vice versa, use the

icon. Use the **ending and the brightness**. switch

Camcorder

Camcorder enables you to shoot video clips.

Opening Camcorder

Touch the Home Key > \square > Camcorder to open the camcorder. Notes:

You can switch from the camcorder to the camera quickly:

Drag the switch left.

Shooting Videos

- 1. Touch (to start shooting.
- 2. Touch **(**) to stop shooting. **Notes:**
- Touch the picture at the bottom of right corner (portrait mode) of your camcorder screen to view the video clip just shot.
- Touch the Menu Key > Gallery to view all of your video clips.

Video Settings

From the Camcorder Screen, touch adjust color effect, video quality, video/audio encoder, video duration, and restore the default video settings.

Touch to adjust the white balance. White balance enables the camera to capture colors more accurately by adjusting to the current lighting <u>environment</u>.

Touch **I** to change white balance setting.

Touch **/High/Low/MMS/YouTube** to select preset video shooting mode, or customize your own.

Touch to select front camera or back camera.

Under the preset **High**, **Low**, **MMS**, or **YouTube** mode, the settings for video quality, video encoder, audio encoder, and video duration cannot be changed.

FM Radio

With the FM Radio, you can search for radio channels, listen to them, and save them on your device. Note that the quality of the radio broadcast depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area. The wired headset works as an antenna, so always connect the headset when using the radio. When you receive an incoming call while listening to the radio, the radio will be turned off during the call.

Opening FM Radio

You need to insert a headset to your Reliance 3G Tab before opening the FM radio.

Touch the **Home Key** > \square > **FM Radio** to open the FM radio.

After opening the FM radio, you will see the 💼 icon in the status bar.

Listening to FM Radio

- Press the Volume Keys to adjust the volume.
- Touch the **Menu Key > Scan** to scan the radio station.
- Touch the Menu Key > Settings to set up the Regional Band, Audio Output Mode, Alternate Frequency and Revert to Factory Defaults.
- Touch the Menu Key > Sleep to set the FM radio sleep timer.
- Touch the **Menu Key > Enable Speaker** to enable or disable the speaker.

Music

You can play digital audio files from your memory card in Music 💽.

Opening Music

You need to copy the audio files you want to play to your memory card first.

- 1. Touch the Home Key > \square > Music to open Music Screen.
- 2. Select a file to open.

Playing Music

- 1. Touch Artists/Albums/Songs/Playlists to get the songs you want to play.
- 2. Touch a song from the list to start playing. **Notes:**

Press the Volume Keys to adjust the volume.

Creating Playlists

You can create some playlists to organize your music files.

- 1. Select a music file you want to add to a new playlist.
- 2. Touch and hold on the file until a shortcut menu pops up.
- 3. Touch Add to playlist.
- 4. Touch New.

5. Enter the playlist name and touch **Save**.

The playlist is created and the file you selected is added to the playlist.

Managing Your Playlists

- 1. Touch Playlists from the Music Screen to view all playlists.
- 2. Hold on the playlist you want to play or edit until a shortcut menu pops up.
 - Touch Play to play the playlist.
 - Touch Delete to delete the playlist.
 - Touch Rename to edit the playlist name.

Adding Songs to Your Playlist

- 1. Open the folder where the song you want to add to a playlist is.
- 2. Hold on the song until a shortcut menu pops up.
- 3. Select Add to playlist.
- 4. Select a playlist from the list.

Setting a Song as Ringtone

- 1. Open the folder where the song you want to set as ringtone is.
- 2. Hold on the song until a shortcut menu pops up.

3. Select Use as phone ringtone. Tips:

You can also set a song as ringtone when you are playing it by touching the **Menu Key > Use as ringtone**.

Using Google[™] Music

The **Music** application () works with Google Music, Google's online music store and streaming service. You can stream via mobile data or Wi-Fi and listen to you favorite songs that you've added to your online Google Music library. You can also play audio files you've copied directly to your device from a computer.

NOTE: The availability of Google Music is dependent on your region. If it is not available, or you don't have a mobile data or Wi-Fi connection, you

can only play music stored on your device.

Opening the Music App

Press Home Key and touch \mathbb{H} > Music (\mathbb{M}) to open the application.

Viewing the Music Library and Playing Songs

The music library combines your online Google Music library and songs stored on your device. Swipe left or right in portrait mode to view your library sorted by time, artists, albums, songs, playlists, or genres. You can also touch the triangle next to **Recent**, **Artists**, **Albums**, **Songs**, **Playlists**, or **Genres** in landscape mode to switch the view. Touch a song in your library to start playing it.

Videos

You can use Videos to play your video files.

Opening Videos

Touch the **Home Key** > \square > **Videos** to open the video player.

Your device will show you all video files saved on your memory card.

Playing Videos

Copy the video file to your memory card before playing it.

- 1. Touch the video file you want to play from the Videos Screen.
- 2. Touch on the screen to show the control bar. You can pause, rewind, fast forward, or jump to any part of the video with the time bar.

Note-Tab preloaded Video player can only play video formats like mp4,3gp etc.to play video files of other formats like avi.wmv etc, please download free video player applications like RockPlayer lite,Mobo video player etc from Android market.

Gallery

Gallery helps you view pictures and play back videos. For pictures, you can also do some basic editing tasks. For instance, set them as your wallpaper or contact icon, and share with your friends.

Sound Recorder

Sound Recorder enables you to record your voice memos that you can set as ringtone.

Opening Sound Recorder

Touch the Home Key > \square > Sound Recorder to open the sound recorder.

Notes: You need to install a memory card to use Sound Recorder.

Recording Your Memo

- 1. Get the microphone near to your mouth.
- 2. Touch is to start recording.
- 3. Touch lostop recording.
- 4. Touch log to play back the voice recording.

5. Touch **OK** to save the voice recording, or touch **Discard** to discard the recording.

Notes:

You can find your recordings in **Home Key** > \square > **Music** > **Playlists** > **My recordings**. If you want to set a recording as ringtone, hold the recording and select **Use as phone ringtone** from the pop-up shortcut menu.





Sharing Mobile Data Connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable: USB tethering. You can also share your phone's data connection with at least five devices at once, by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.


