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## Safety Information

## General Care

Your handset contains delicate electronic circuitry, magnets and battery systems. You should treat it with care and give particular attention to the following points:

- Do not allow the handset, battery or accessories to come into contact with liquids or moisture at any time. Do not immerse the handset in any liquid.
- Do not place the handset alongside computer disks, credit cards, travel cards and other magnetic media. The information contained on disks or cards may be affected by the handset.
- Do not place anything on the handset.
- Do not paint the handset.
- Do not leave the handset or the battery in places where the temperature could exceed $60^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$, e.g. on a car dashboard or a windowsill, behind glass in direct sunlight, etc.
- Do not remove the handset's battery while the handset is switched on.
- Take care not to allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.
- Do not dispose of battery packs in a fire. The handset's Li-ION batteries may be safely disposed of at a Li-ION recycling point.
- Do not put the handset's battery in your mouth, as battery electrolytes may be toxic if swallowed.
- Do not attempt to dismantle the handset or any of its accessories.
- This equipment is fitted with an internal battery; take it to a qualified service engineer when the replacement of the battery is required.
- There is a risk of explosion if the battery is replaced with an incorrect battery type. Dispose of the used battery in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Do not put a battery into a microwave oven, dryer, or highpressure container.
Do not contact battery directly to an electric outlet or cigarette lighter charger. Use only approved charger units.
- Do not pierce battery with a sharp object such as a needle.
- When the battery is thrown away, be sure it is non-conducting by applying vinyl tape to the ( + ) and (-) terminals.
- Do not disassemble or modify the battery.
- Do not drop, throw, or subject the handset to rough treatment.
- Stop using the battery if abnormal heat, odor, discoloration, deformation, or abnormal condition is detected during use, charge, or storage.
- In the unlikely event of a battery leak, keep the battery discharge away from your eyes or skin. If the leakage does come into contact with the eyes or skin, please flush thoroughly in clean water and consult with a doctor.
- Do not use a damaged or deformed battery.
- Do not solder a battery directly.
- Remove the battery whose life cycle has expired from equipment immediately.
- The earpiece may become warm during normal use. Also, the handset itself may become warm while the battery is being charged.
- When a handset is in vibration mode, the vibration can sometimes cause the handset to move.
- Be careful not to place the handset near heat sources (such as a heater) or too close to the edge of the table.
- Use a damp or anti-static cloth to clean the handset. Do not use an ordinary dry cloth or electrostatic cloth. Do not use chemical or abrasive cleaners as these could damage the casing.
- Third party equipment: The use of third party equipment, cables or accessories, not made or authorized by manufacturer, may invalidate the warranty of your handset and also adversely affect the phone's safety/operation.
- Remember to make backup copies of all important data on your handset.
- Remember to recycle: the cardboard packing supplied with this handset is ideal for recycling.
Caution:
Caution explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type.
Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions.


## General Guidelines

- In some countries national law unapproved private copying of copyrighted material. Please check the national legislation of the applicable country concerning the use of such material.

- Do not try to make a call or conversation while the temperature of charging battery is above $50^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$.
- Take care not to put your handset in the back pocket of your trousers or skirt and then sit on it. Also, do not put your phone at the bottom of bag where it may subject to excessive weight or pressure. Doing so may damage the LCD and camera lens and cause them malfunction.
- The operation of some medical electronic devices, such as hearing aids and pacemakers, may be affected if a handset is used next to them. Observe any caution signs and the manufacturer's recommendations.
- Do not leave the handset discharged or without a battery for a long time, otherwise some data may be erased.
- Your phone contains metal, which may cause you an itch, a rash or eczema depending on your physical condition.


## Aircraft Safety

The F118 is capable of operating in UMTS (Universal Mobile Telecommunication System), also known as 3G, GSM (Global System for Mobile Communications) or 2G, and GPRS (General Packet Radio Service) or 2.5 G , and can realize seamless handover between different networks

## Starting Up

## Open the Back Cover

1. Hold the Power/End key to turn off the phone.
2. Lift the top of the back cover from the notch and remove the back cover as shown below.


## Installing the Battery

Notes:

- The phone automatically turns off if the battery power is too low.
- If you are not going to use the battery for a long time, remove it from the phone and store it in a cool dry place.

1. Hold the Power/End key to turn off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover of your phone.
3. Carefully insert the battery with the contacts located against the metal springs.
4. Push down the battery until it clicks into place.

5. Replace the cover on the back of the phone.

Caution:

- Make sure the cover is lined up before pressing it into place. Do not force it. Doing so will damage the back cover.


## Installing the SIM Card

You can obtain a SIM card from your service provider when you sign on as a subscriber.
Caution:

- Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Keep the card away from electricity and magnetism.
- Don't touch the metal surface of the SIM card. Doing so could cause information on the card to be lost or destroyed.
- Disconnect the charger and other accessories from your phone and remove the battery before inserting and removing your SIM card.

1. Hold the Power/End key to turn off the phone.
2. Remove the back cover of your phone.
3. Hold the SIM card with the metal contacts facing downward and the cut corner at the upper right. Insert the card into the card holder and push it until it clicks into position.
4. Replace the cover on the back of your phone.

## Inserting memory card

Your phone supports microSD cards up to 32 GB. This gives you loads of memory in which to save images, audio and video files.

Note:
microSD logo Micro is a trademark of the SD Card Association.

1. Remove the back cover.
2. Insert the microSD card carefully with the metal contacts facing downwards, until it is pushed into the right position. As you can see, only part of the microSD card needs to be inserted into the slot.

To remove the card, slide the card out of the slot.

## Charging

Your phone uses a rechargeable battery. When you first unpack the phone, the battery is not fully charged, but there might be enough power to turn on the phone. You can use the provided charger to charge the phone battery.

1. Open the USB port cover.
2. Insert the charger's USB adapter into the USB port.
3. Plug the charger into a standard AC wall outlet.
4. When the battery is fully charged, unplug the charger and disconnect it from the phone.

Notes:

- The phone automatically switches off if the battery power is too low.
- Make sure the charger's connector is inserted correctly. Do not force the connector into the port.
- The battery will remain fully charged for 3 to 4 hours.
- Only use the charger provided by the original provider. Using an unapproved charger might be dangerous and violate the authorization and warranty rules of the phone.
- If the phone is used too often when the battery is low or not used for a long time, the screen may not display the charge indicator until the battery has been continuously charged for 10 to 40 minutes.
- To get the maximum performance out of your battery, it is recommended that you completely charge the battery before using the phone for the first time. A new battery's full performance is only reached after three complete charge and discharge cycles have been finished.
- Do not charge the battery if the temperature is under $0^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ or above $45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$.


## Security Code

## Handset Code

Handset password can protect your handset efficiently and avoid illegal usage. If handset password protection is activated, you should input the correct password at handset start-up.

- For a new bought handset, the protection function is not activated and the default password is 0000 .
- In standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Security > Activate security codes $>$ Handset code to start or stop password protection.
- In standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Security > Change security codes > Handset code to change handset password. It is suggested to change the password according to your requirement.
Notes:
Please remember the password you set, without it your phone cannot be used normally and you will need to contact your service provider to unlock it.


## PIN Code

PIN code is the personal identification code of (U)SIM card, used to avoid illegal usage for your (U)SIM card. Once PIN code is started, the correct PIN code should be input at handset start-up.

- For the new bought card, the default code is supplied by the service provider.
- In standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Security > Activate security codes > PIN code to start or stop PIN code.
- In standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Security > Change security codes $>$ PIN code to change PIN code.
- If you input wrong PIN code continuously for three times, the (U)SIM card will be locked, and you are prompted to input PUK code to unlock.
Notes:
If you change PIN code, please remember it clearly.


## PIN2 Code

PIN2 is needed for some settings.
For the new bought card, the default code is supplied by the service provider.
In standby mode, select Menu > Settings > Security > Change security codes > PIN2 code to change PIN2 code.

## PUK Code

PUK code is the specified unlock code for (U)SIM card, when (U)SIM card is locked, input the correct PUK code and then input the new set PIN code, (U)SIM card then can be used normally.

- PUK code may be supplied with the new bought card, the detail can refer to the service provider.
- PUK code can only be input continuously for 10 times. If you input wrong PUK code for 10 times, the (U)SIM card will be locked indefinitely.
Notes:
If PUK code is supplied with the new bought card, please keep it safely.


## Basic

## Power On/Off

Notes:

- Do not turn your phone on in areas where wireless phone use is not permitted, or when it could cause interference or danger.
Hold the End/Power Key to turn your phone on or off.
Tips:
- When prompted, enter your PIN (Personal Identification Number) code or handset code and press the OK Key.
- The PIN code is the password provided by your network service provider. You cannot use the SIM card without it.
- When the PIN code or handset code is accepted, the phone automatically searches for the network. After a few seconds, your phone displays idle mode.


## Standby Mode

After power on the phone, when the name of network is displayed on the screen, the phone is in the standby mode and ready for use.

## Auto power on/off

Use this function to power on/off your phone automatically at the predefined time.

1. In standby mode, press the OK Key [Menu] to enter the main menu.
2. Select Settings > Phone > Auto power on/off.
3. Switch state to On/Off to enable/disable this function.
4. Input Time, if you enable this function, then your phone will auto power on/off automatically at the predefined time.

## Making Calls

You can call the numbers of the other party directly or you can make a call through contacts, call log, and speed dial numbers.

1. In standby mode, enter a phone number.
2. Press the Call Key to make a voice call.

Or Select Options > Call > Video call to make a video call.
3. Press the End Key to end the call.

## Options for Voice Call

During a call, you can press the Left Soft Key [Options] for more options. The options vary depending on the function you are currently using.

- Hold /Active: Put the current call on hold or retrieve the call.
- End call: End the current call.
- Record: Record the current call. You can also press the OK Key [Stop] to stop recording.
- DTMF off/on: Disable or enable sending the DTMF tone.
- Message: Switch to the Messages menu during a call.
- Contacts: Switch to the Contacts menu during a call.
- Browser: Browse the Internet during a call.


## Options for Video Call

During a video call, you can press the Left Soft Key [Options] for more options. The options vary depending on the function you are currently using.

- Hold/Cancel hold: Put the current call on hold or retrieve the call.
- Start recording video: Record the current call. You can also press the OK Key [Stop] to stop recording.
- Block/Activate my image: Block or send my picture during the call.
- Zoom: Adjust the image size.
- PIP off/on: Close or open the local image.
- Exchange PIP: Switch between the primary and secondary screen.
- New text message: Switch to the new text message interface.
- Contacts: Switch to the contacts interface.


## Calls History

In standby mode, press the OK Key [Menu] and select Recent Call to check the call log.

## Text Input

Your phone provides the following input methods: Predictive Text Mode Input (En), Multitap Input (abc/Abc/ABC), and Numbers Input (123).

In the message edited interface you can also press \# Key, and then select English to change the input language.

## Contacts

## Adding Contact

You can store contacts with a variety of phone and fax numbers and additional address details.
The phone can store up to 500 items. The capacity of the phone book on your (U)SIM card depends on the type of (U)SIM card provided by your service provider.. And the default location is your phone.

1. In standby mode, press the Right Soft Key [Contacts].
2. Select Left Soft Key [Options] > Add new contact, and press the OK Key [Select].
3. Enter the information of contact, such as name, number, and so on.
4. Press the OK Key [Save] to save the new contact.

## Searching Contact

1. In standby mode, press the Right Soft Key [Contacts].
2. Enter a letter, and then the phone will show all the contacts starting with such a letter.
Eg: To search "John", press the $\mathbf{5}$ Key once for ' j '. All names starting with 'J' or ' j ' are displayed.

## Setting Speed Dial

1. In standby mode, press the Right Soft Key [Contact].
2. Use the Navigation Keys to select a contact, press the Left Soft Key [Options] and select Set speed dial.
3. Press the Up Key or Down Key to select an empty slot.
4. Press the OK Key [Setup] to finish.

## Making a Speed Dial

Notes:
The 1 Key is reserved for the Voice Mail number.

1. In standby mode, press and hold the corresponding number key (2 to 9 ) in the speed dial list to make the call.
2. Press the End Key to end the call.

## Other Options

In standby mode, press the Right Soft Key to enter the Contacts. Press the Left Soft Key to enter the submenu list, and you can do the following operations:

2. Enter the recipient(s) party's number. (Or Press the OK Key [Recipient] to choose the recipient(s))
3. Press the Down Key to the text field.
4. Edit the message.

Select Left Soft Key [Options]> Templates to insert pre-set message.
5. Press the OK Key [Send] to send the message.

## Sending MMS

1. In the standby mode, press the Left Soft Key [Messages].
2. Enter the recipient(s) party's number. (Or Press the OK Key [Recipient] to choose the recipient(s))
3. Press the Down Key to the text field.
4. Select Left Soft Key [Options] to insert image, audio, video, sub, or attachment(s).
5. Edit the message.
6. Press the OK Key [Send] to send the message.

## Sending Email

1. In standby mode, press the OK Key [Menu] to enter the main menu.
2. Select the Messages > Email > New Email, and press the OK Key [Select].
3. Enter the recipient's Email address. (Or press the OK Key [Contacts] to choose the recipient(s))
4. Press the Down Key to access the Copy to Field and enter the recipient(s) party's Email address.
5. Press the Down Key to access the Subject field and edit the subject.
6. Edit the Email.

Press the Left Soft Key [Options] to insert Files, New image, New audio, New video, Attachments, Templates, or Insert signature.
7. Press the OK Key [Send] to send your Email.

You can view or change the message settings. The message centre number is stored on your (U)SIM card supplied by your service provider. The MMS and SMS settings are preset by your Service Provider.

| Delivery <br> Report | You can select On/Off to receive or reject a <br> popup message to inform you when the message <br> is delivered to the recipient. |
| Cell name <br> display | Switch On/Off to display the cell name function. |

The phone has several templates for call rejecting, and you can edit them.

## Email Settings

From the main menu, select the Messages > Email > Settings, and press the OK Key [Select] to make the following settings.

## Downloading via Browser

1. When viewing network page, use the Up Key or Down Key to select the link, press the OK Key to open the objective link.
2. Press the OK Key [OK] to confirm and start downloading. The downloading information will be saved in handset memory.
Caution:
Do not download and use software and file from an unknown source.

## Bluetooth

## Connecting the Bluetooth Device

1. In the standby mode, press the OK Key [Menu] to enter main menu.
2. Select Tools > Bluetooth > My Devices.
3. Press the OK Key [Search] to search the available Bluetooth devices.
4. Select one device from the displayed list and press the OK Key to confirm.
5. Enter the pass code when asked for permission to connect to the device. After the paired device verifies the pass code, the device will be added successfully.

## Sending Files via Bluetooth

Firstly please confirm following two items:

- Enable Bluetooth function.
- The paired device is visible.

1. Select your desired file, and select Left Soft Key [Options] > Send > Via Bluetooth.
2. Select the aim device from the device list, and press the OK Key [Send] to send.
Receiving Files via Bluetooth
Firstly please enable Bluetooth function.
3. If the paired device tries to send a file to your phone, one popup dialogue will appear in your screen.
4. Press the Left Soft Key [Yes] to accept the incoming file, or press the Right Soft Key [No] to reject the incoming file.

## Modem Function

## Modem Settings

Please confirm:

- Valid (U)SIM card is inserted.
- GPRS configuration or dialing connection is available.

Select OK Key [Menu] > Settings > Connections > Modem settings.
Use the parameters obtained from your service provider to complete the modem settings.

## Use the Handset as Modem

Connect your phone to computer with supplied data cable; your phone can work as one external modem for the computer. For detailed information, please consult your service provider.

## Multimedia

## Camera

1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Camera, and press the OK Key [Select].
2. Aim the camera lens at a person/place.
3. Press the OK Key [Capture] to take one photo, and it will be saved in My Pictures directory automatically.
> Press the Right Soft Key [Back] to return to the picture capturing screen.
> Press the Left Soft Key [Options] to send the photo via MMS, Email, or Bluetooth, or to set it as wallpaper, you can also discard it.

## Video Camera

Notes:
You can scroll the Right Key to switch to camera mode.

1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Video camera, and press the OK Key [Select].
2. Set the video parameters.
3. Press the OK Key to start recording.
4. Press the OK Key again to pause, then press the OK Key to resume recording.
5. Press the Right Soft Key [Stop] to stop recording, and the video will be saved in My Videos directory automatically.
> Press the Left Soft Key [Send] to send the video file via MMS, Email, or Bluetooth, you can also discard it.
> Press the Right Soft Key [Back] to return to the video recording screen.

## FM radio

Insert the personal hands free kit (PHF). The headset acts as the antenna for the FM radio.

1. In standby mode, press OK Key [Menu] to enter main menu.
2. Select Multimedia > FM radio.
3. Tune the required station using the Left/Right Key or Options > Auto Search/Set Channel/Manual_search.
> Auto Search scans automatically for channels.
> Use Set Channel to enter the frequency using the keypad and * key to access the decimal point.
> Use Manual_search to scan the channel manually.
4. From the Channel list interface select Options > Rename to personalize the channel name eg ABC
If an incoming call is received, the radio will be suspended while you answer the call.

## Voice Recorder

1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Audio record, and press the OK Key [Select].
2. Press the OK Key [Record] to start recording your voice memo.
3. Press the OK Key [Pause] to pause, press the OK Key [Contin.] to resume recording, and press the Right Soft Key [Stop] to stop recording.
4. After recording a voice memo, it will be saved in My Audios directory automatically, and you can continue the following operations:
i. Press the OK Key [Play] to replay the voice memo.
ii. Press the Right Soft Key [Back] to return to the voice recording screen.
iii. Press the Left Soft Key [Options] to send the memo via MMS/Email/Bluetooth, rename or discard it.

## Playlist

1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Music > Playlist, and press the OK Key [Select].
2. If there is no playlist, press the OK Key [Add] to create a new playlist.
i. Enter the playlist name and press the OK Key.
ii. Select an audio file from Audios/Others folder.
iii. Press the OK Key [Mark] to mark all the files one by one.
iv. Press the Left Soft Key [Done] to save the audio files to the playlist.
3. Press the OK Key [Open] to open the playlist.
4. Press the OK Key [Play] to play the audio files in the playlist.

When you create a playlist, press the Left Soft Key [Options] for more options:

- Edit Playlist: Edit the currently selected playlist.
- New Playlist: Add a new playlist file.
- Rename: Rename the selected playlist file.
- Delete: Delete the selected playlist file.
- Delete all: Delete all playlists.
- Info.: View the information of the selected playlist.

Notes:
You can also select Multimedia > Music > All Music to show all music file, then press the OK Key [Open] play it.

## Picture

1. From the main menu, select Menu > Multimedia > Picture > All Pictures to show all your saved images.
2. Press the OK Key [Open] to view the selected image.

Press the Left Soft Key [Options] for more options:

- Delete: Delete the currently selected image.
- Add to favorites: Add the currently selected image to Favorites directory.
- Send: Send the image via MMS/Email/Bluetooth.
- Set as wallpaper: Set the currently selected image as wallpaper.
- File info.: View the information of the selected slide.
- Help: Show help information.

Notes:
You can also select Multimedia > Picture > Favorites to view all images saved in Favorites directory.

## Streaming URL

1. Select Menu > Multimedia > Video > Streaming URL, and press the OK Key [Select].
2. If there is no streaming URL, press the OK Key [Add] to create one new streaming URL.
i. Enter the tile name and URL.
ii. Press the OK Key [Save].
3. Select the Left Soft Key [Options]>Network settings to set the URL, and the detailed information please consult your service provider.
4. Press the OK Key [Open] to connect the URL.

## Alarm

## Converter

This function allows you to convert currency.

## File Manager

File Manager is a storage area for Pictures, Audios, Videos, and Other files.
Select Menu > File Mgr to enter the file manager. Notes:
Preloaded files in the Wallpapers and Ring folders are read only and cannot be deleted.

## Profiles

Your handset supplies several predefined user profiles, and you can choose a certain profile according to your surroundings.
You can also edit the appropriate profile depending on the current condition.

## Phone

1. In the standby mode, press OK Key [Menu] to enter main menu.

> Select Time and Date to set time, date, and time style.
> Select Missed calls alert to set the ringtone notification for missed calls.

> Select Auto power on/off to power on or off the handset at the predefined time.

> Select Backlight duration to adjust backlight duration.
> Select Brightness to adjust the screen brightness.
> Select Keyboard light to adjust keypad light time.
> Select Owner name to input owner name, displayed in idle screen.
> Select Greeting to input greeting words, displayed in power on screen.

## Connections

1. In the standby mode, press OK Key [Menu] to enter main menu.
2. Select Settings > Connections
> Select Network settings to set preferred mode and preferred selection.
> Select Access point settings to view the access point list.
> Select Modem settings to set modem parameters, you can use data cable to connect handset and computer and use handset as modem. For detailed parameter, please turn to your service provider.
> Select Profile connect to create or edit connection data for service providers.
> Select PC connection to choose the connection method between your computer and phone.

## Calls

Call forwarding
Call forwarding allows you to divert your incoming calls to another phone number. Contact your service provider for more information
and availability.

- Always: Divert all incoming calls unconditionally.
- When busy: Divert incoming calls when the line is busy.
- When no reply: Divert calls when there is no answer.
- When unreachable: Divert calls when the phone is turned off or the phone is not in an area covered by service network.
When the Call forwarding function is activated on your phone, select Menu > Settings > Calls > Call forwarding > Cancel all call forwarding, and press the OK Key to cancel all the call diverts.


## Call waiting

If a call comes in when you are already on a call, you are notified with a call waiting tone. The phone shows the number/name of the waiting call. Contact your service provider for more information.

## Call barring

Call barring allows you to restrict the calls that you make or receive.
To change the settings, you need to have a network password from your service provider. Contact your service provider for more information.

- Bar all outgoing calls: Calls cannot be made.
- Bar outgoing calls (international): International calls cannot be made.
- Outgoing international calls except for calls to the home country: When abroad, calls can be made only to numbers within the current country and to your home country, where your home network operator is located.
- Bar all incoming calls: Calls cannot be received.
- Bar incoming call when international roaming: Calls cannot be received when you are using your phone outside your home service area.

When the Call barring function is activated on your phone, select Menu > Settings > Calls > Call barring > Cancel all call barring, and press the OK Key [Select] to cancel all settings about barring. Select Menu > Settings > Calls > Call barring > Change password to change password of call barring.

## Send My Number

This function allows you to send or hide your phone number when making calls. You can also select Set by network. The network then chooses whether to show/hide the phone number. This function requires network support.

## Service dial number

Enter the service dial number, and then press OK Key to save it. For the detailed information please contact your service provider.

## Set Videophone

Enter the VIG Number, Select UUS Type and enter UUS String. Contact your Service Provider for more details.

## Fixed dial numbers

If you activate this function, you cannot dial the numbers out of the fixed dial list.

This menu shows the list of the fixed dial numbers.
